Typical AIM Week

Day 1: Arrival/check in: uniform issue; opening ceremonies; meet with the cadre

Day 2: Academy tour; engineering introduction; military training; intercompany athletics

Day 3: Engineering session; meet with coaches; marching practice; sports; cookout



AIM Week cont'd.

Day 4: Sailing; engineering session; physical fitness exam

Day 5: Final indoctrination test; formal room preparation and inspection; present diplomas

Day 6: Engineering competition; group photo; battalion review and graduation
